RESOLUTION OF INTENT TO SELL BY INTERNET AUCTION PERSONAL PROPERTY, INCLUDING MOTOR VEHICLES, ROAD MACHINERY, EQUIPMENT, TOOLS, OR SUPPLIES THAT IS NOT NEEDED FOR PUBLIC USE, IS OBSOLETE, OR IS UNFIT FOR THE USE FOR WHICH IT WAS ACQUIRED.

PREAMBLE

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of Concord Township, Delaware County, Ohio ("Board") routinely has personal property, including motor vehicles, road machinery, equipment, tools, or supplies that is not needed for public use, is obsolete, or is unfit for the use for which it was acquired, which it desires to sell; and,

WHEREAS, the Board desires to sell that property by Internet auction; and,

WHEREAS, Ohio Revised Code §505.10(D) authorizes the Board to sell personal property, including motor vehicles, road machinery, equipment, tools, or supplies, that is not needed for public use, is obsolete, or is unfit for the use for which it was acquired, by Internet auction.

RESOLUTION

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CONCORD TOWNSHIP BOARD OF TRUSTEES AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. INTENT TO SELL PERSONAL PROPERTY BY INTERNET AUCTION

It is the intent of the Board to sell by Internet auction personal property, including motor vehicles, road machinery, equipment, tools, or supplies, that is not needed for public use, is obsolete, or is unfit for the use for which it was acquired.

When property is to be sold by Internet auction, the Board or its representative may establish a minimum price that will be accepted for specific items and may establish any other terms and conditions for the particular sale, including requirements for pick-up or delivery, method of payment, and sales tax. This type of information shall be provided on the Internet at the time of the auction and may be provided before that time upon request, after the terms and conditions have been determined by the Board or its representative.

SECTION 2. BOARD REPRESENTATIVE

Resolution. He/she is hereby authorized to negotiate on behalf of the Board a contract with a contractor to conduct Internet auctions consistent with this Resolution.

SECTION 3. EFFECTIVE YEAR OF RESOLUTION

This Resolution is effective only for calendar year 2015.

SECTION 4, AUCTIONS TO BE CONDUCTED BY CONTRACTOR

The Board, having negotiated a contract, shall contract with GovDeals, Inc. ("GovDeals"), a Delaware corporation, having its principal place of business at 5907 Carmichael Place, Montgomery, Alabama 36117, to conduct the Internet auctions. SECTION 5. DESCRIPTION OF HOW AUCTIONS WILL BE CONDUCTED

Township owned personal property, including motor vehicles, road machinery, equipment, tools, or supplies, that is not needed for public use, is obsolete, or is unfit for the use for which it was acquired will be posted on an Internet-based auction system for sale for potential buyers to bid upon and purchase these items. The Internet site where the items are posted is owned, managed, and operated by a contractor known as GovDeals, Inc. ("GovDeals"). The Board will contract with GovDeals to post items and act as a representative of the Board to conduct the auction. Items will be listed for no less than the minimum number of days established by this Resolution.

GovDeals will charge a fee to the Board for items that are sold through GovDeal's Internet auction. For any items that are sold, GovDeals will charge a total fee of twelve and one half percent (12.5%) of the sales price. Of that fee, the Board pays zero percent (0%) and the winning bidder pays twelve and one half percent (12.5%). There is a minimum fee of Five Dollars (\$5.00).

The base fee of seven and one half percent (7.5%) is reduced as follows on sales where the sale price is greater than One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00):

- 1. Where an asset sells for more than \$100,000, and up to \$500,000 the GovDeals fee is seven and one-half percent (7.5%) of the winning bid up to \$100,000, plus five and one-half percent (5.5%) of the winning bid for auction proceeds in excess of \$100,000 up to \$500,000.
- 2. SECTION 7. GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF SALES

The following terms and conditions shall apply to all sales via Internet auction:

- 1. Guaranty Waiver. All assets are offered for sale "AS IS, WHERE IS." The Board of Trustees of Concord Township, Delaware County, Ohio and/or Concord Township, Delaware County, Ohio (Seller) make no warranty, guaranty or representation of any kind, expressed or implied, as to the merchantability or fitness for any purpose of the property offered for sale. The Buyer is not entitled to any payment for loss of profit or any other money damages special, direct, indirect or consequential.
- 2. Description Warranty. Seller warrants to the Buyer the property offered for sale will conform to its description. Any claim for mis-description must be made prior to removal of the property. If Seller confirms the property does not conform to the description, Seller will keep the property and refund any money paid. The liability of the Seller shall

not exceed the actual purchase price of the property. Please note upon removal of the property, all sales are final.

- 3. Personal and Property Risk. Persons attending during exhibition, sale or removal of goods assume all risks of damage of or loss to person and property and specifically release the Seller and GovDeals from liability therefore.
- 4. Inspection. Most assets offered for sale are used and may contain defects not immediately detectable. Bidders may inspect the property prior to bidding. WHEREAS, the Concord Township Board of Township Trustees ("Board") is authorized by Section 309.09(B) of the Revised Code to employ attorneys on an annual basis other than the prosecuting attorney to represent the Township and its officers, boards and commissions in their official capacities and to advise them on legal matters; and

WHEREAS, Section 309.09(B) of the Revised Code provides that no such attorney may be employed except on the order of the Board, duly entered upon its Journal, in which the compensation to be paid for the attorney's legal services shall be fixed; and

WHEREAS, the Board finds it necessary to appoint attorneys to counsel and represent the Township on an annual basis for calendar year 2015 in such matters as the Board or its designee may refer to them; and

WHEREAS, the Board has appropriated the sum of $\frac{5000.00}{100}$ for legal services for 2015;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Township Trustees of Concord Township, Delaware County, Ohio, that:

SECTION 1. Donald F. Brosius of Brosius, Johnson & Griggs, LLC and the law firm of Brosius, Johnson & Griggs, LLC, are hereby employed on an annual basis for calendar year 2015 as the Township's legal counsel to represent the Township and its officers, boards and commissions in their official capacities and to advise them in connection with such matters as may be referred to said Counsel by or on behalf of the Board or its designee.

SECTION 2. The compensation for such counsel during 2015 shall be paid as follows: \$205.00 per hour partner attorney time; \$185.00 per hour senior associate time; \$160.00 per hour associate time; \$90.00 per hour law clerk time; and \$75.00 per hour legal assistant time; plus out-of-pocket expense reimbursements; provided that the total compensation shall not exceed $\frac{5000.00}{1000.00}$ without further action by this Board.

SECTION 3. The attorneys may be discharged at any time by majority vote of the Board.

SECTION 4. The Township Fiscal Officer is directed to send a copy of this Resolution to the law firm.

WHEREAS, sections 9.482 and 307.15 of the Ohio Revised Code provide authority for certain intergovernmental cooperation agreements between political subdivisions, including agreements for road maintenance materials and agreements to exercise any power, perform any function, or render any service for the contracting recipient political subdivision that the contracting recipient political subdivision is otherwise legally authorized to exercise, perform, or render; and

WHEREAS, Concord Twp. is in need of rock salt for snow and ice control on public roads; and

WHEREAS, Delaware County will loan salt through the 2014-15 Delaware County Salt Loan Program ("Program");

NOW, THEREFORE, Be it Resolved and/or Ordained by Board of Trustees intending to be legally bound unto Delaware County, that Concord Twp. hereby requests to borrow rock salt below and authorizes Todd Cooper to enter into agreement with Delaware County in accordance with the terms and conditions of the Program.

2014-15 DELAWARE COUNTY SALT LOAN PROGRAM

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

<u>Purpose</u>: The 2014-15 Delaware County Salt Loan Program ("Program") is established to provide up to 3,500 tons of rock salt available out of the Delaware County Engineer's Office (DCEO) salt inventory on a loan basis to any local road maintenance agency within Delaware County that is in need of salt for use on roads within the agency's jurisdiction.

<u>Program Dates:</u> The Program will run from the date of establishment to April 15, 2015.

Solicitation for Salt Requests: DCEO will solicit requests from agencies that have been unable to obtain sufficient quantities of rock salt for the winter of 2014-15. After all requests for salt are received, if total tonnage requested is less than the amount available, all requests will be fulfilled. If the total tonnage requested is more than the amount available, salt will be made available pro rata based on each agency's request through the usual purchasing contract of that agency compared to tonnage available, or in an amount determined by DCEO if the pro rata share calculation is not applicable. Agencies will then be notified of the amount of salt they can receive under this agreement.

If additional requests for salt are made to the County and if DCEO determines that additional salt is available to be loaned, the county may repeat the offering of salt in additional round(s) as described above.

<u>Authority to Sign:</u> The Delaware County Administrator is authorized to act on behalf of the Board of County Commissioners to enter into agreement with Borrowing agencies subject to the terms and conditions of this Program.

<u>Legislation</u>: Prior to picking up salt, Delaware County must receive a copy of the approved Program Agreement.

Salt Pick-Up Procedure: Borrowing agencies must pick up salt at the Delaware County Engineer's salt storage facility at 4020 U.S. 42 North, Delaware, Ohio. Salt will be weighed and loaded by County Engineer personnel. Borrower is required to provide trucking. DCEO anticipates salt will be available for pick up by December 1, 2014, provided that initial winter contract deliveries are received by the County.

Return of Borrowed Salt: Borrower shall return to the Delaware County Engineer's salt storage facility at 4020 U.S. 42 North, Delaware, Ohio, or other facility as directed by the DCEO, an equal amount of salt, measured by weight, in substantially the same condition, gradation and quality as the loaned salt, no later than April 15, 2015, plus payment of Handling Charges.

<u>Alternate Form of Repayment:</u> Alternatively, after making a good faith effort to return the borrowed amount of salt, if Borrower is unable to return the amount borrowed, Borrower shall repay Delaware County for the tons of salt borrowed in an amount equal to the following, plus Handling Charges, with payment due by June 1, 2015:

- 1. The price per ton obtained by the County in the 2015 ODOT cooperative summer fill-up contract, or
- 2. If County does not participate in the summer fill-up contract, the price per ton obtained by County in the 2015 ODOT cooperative winter contract; or,
- 3. If the County does not participate in either of the above contracts or is unable to obtain the amount of salt required to replace all salt borrowed by the Borrowers named in this agreement, the Borrower shall make repayment based on the market price for salt or other price deemed acceptable by the County.

<u>Handling Charges:</u> A handling charge of \$4.00 per ton of salt loaned under this agreement will be applied to each ton of salt loaned, which includes the cost of loading the loaned salt and the cost of stockpiling returned salt or new salt purchased to replace loaned salt.

<u>Default:</u> In the event Borrower has not submitted payment by June 1, 2015, the payment shall be made by the retention in the county treasury of the amounts due from taxes collected for the Borrower, and the County Auditor and County Treasurer all be governed by this payment provision in settling the accounts for such taxes.

AMENDED AND/OR RESTATED RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF CONCORD TOWNSHIP, DELAWARE COUNTY, OHIO

The Concord Township Board of Trustees, Delaware County, Ohio met at a duly called and authorized meeting of the Board of Trustees on the date set forth below, such meeting being duly called pursuant to a notice stating the time, place and purpose of the meeting received by all Board members, and the following resolutions were made, seconded and adopted by those present at the meeting.

Mr. Garrett	moved to adopt the following Resolution
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WHEREAS, the eligible employees of Concord Township Fire Department participate in the Ohio Police and Fire Pension Fund;

WHEREAS, the Concord Township Board of Trustees has previously adopted to pick-up two percent (2%) of the eleven and one-half percent (11.5%) mandatory contributions required to be paid under Section 742.31 of the Ohio Revised Code for participating employees of Concord Township Fire Department who are members of the Ohio Police and Fire Pension Fund (including the Fire Chief);

WHEREAS, Ohio Police and Fire Pension Fund has adopted new procedures for reporting picked-up contributions in order to properly prepare 1099-R forms for its members;

WHEREAS, the Concord Township Board of Trustees wishes to reaffirm, amend and/or restate its prior resolution in order to continue the pick-up under the new procedures;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that effective as of *salary earned in the pay period* beginning December 22, 2014, the Concord Township Board of Trustees has determined to continue to pick-up zero percent (0%) of the eleven and one-half percent (11.5%) mandatory contributions by the employees who are members of the Ohio Police and Fire Pension Fund by paying the contributions on behalf of the employee;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that said picked up contributions paid by the employer, even though designated as employee contributions for state law purposes, are being paid by the Concord Township Board of Trustees in lieu of said contributions by the employee;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that said picked up contributions will not be included in the gross income of the employees for tax reporting purposes, that is, for federal or state income tax withholding taxes, until distributed from the Ohio Police and Fire Pension Fund;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that said picked up contributions will be included in the gross income of the employees for employment tax purposes, as the contributions are made to the Ohio Police and Fire Pension Fund; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that said employees shall not be entitled to any option of choosing to receive the contributed amounts directly instead of having them paid by the Concord Township Board of Trustees to the Ohio Police and Fire Pension Fund.
