Minutes of the CONCORD TOWNSHIP BOARD OF TRUSTEES Meeting

The Concord Township Board of Trustees met in regular session on Monday, May 24, 2014 at the Concord Township Administrative Building. Chairman Karen Koch called the meeting to order at 7:00p.m. The roll was called; in attendance were Trustees Karen Koch, Joe Garrett and Bart Johnson. Staff attending included Fiscal Officer Jill Davis and Operations Director/Fire Chief Todd Cooper. Minutes from the previous meeting were presented. Motion was made by Mr. Garrett and seconded by Mr. Johnson to approve the minutes with no changes. Vote: Koch-yes, Garrett-yes, Johnson-yes.

Public Input

None.

Old Business

Mr. Garrett updated the Board on the bike path along Home Road. Plans for the property annexed out of Concord Township show a bike path just short of Tree Lake Blvd. The Board would like to connect the path all the way to Liberty Township, but will need to go through the property developer, Scioto Reserve, and private property near a pond area. More research will follow.

The Delaware County Engineer's Request for Assistance response for a bike path near Concord Road and Tartan Fields is unacceptable to the Board. Mr. Garrett noted the solution was not at all what the township wanted. The County said there is not enough room along the roadway for a bike path, but the Board wants to move the bike path completely away from the road. The Board will explore more options.

Mr. Johnson noted the township has preliminary approval from the Delaware Health Department for "hardscape" burial at the demolition site (clean, hard fill), but needs to clarify the term "properly dispose of." Since the demolition timeline was extended to ninety days, it will allow a contractor time to recycle more materials. References for apparent low bidders will be checked.

Old Business

Purchase of the State property at 7990 Dublin Road, Delaware, Ohio, is still progressing. Mr. Johnson is trying to schedule a date to meet with representatives from state purchasing. It was noted the nearby quarry property that recently sold is for sale again, a total of 159 acres.

The 2014 Road Improvement Program work was discussed. The pre-work meeting will be June 3, 2014.

The URC Energy contract was discussed for utility refund services. The Delaware County Prosecutors Office suggested one change to the contract. Mr. Johnson and Mr. Garrett both voiced concerns over the contract details including: fifty percent of savings from future bills go to URC, payment within fifteen days, references, terms of three years going forward, and how paid on those years. No action taken. Mr. Cooper will check into refund of fire truck fuel tax.

New Business

Mr. Garrett requested a copy of the upcoming semi-annual real estate tax settlement report in October.

The new indigent burial policy that was designed by the Ohio Township Association and approved at a previous meeting was presented for signing. An allowance amount for an indigent person's private burial is required for the policy. Motion was made by Mr. Johnson and seconded by Mr. Garrett to set an allowance amount of \$600.00 for an indigent person's private burial. Vote: Koch-yes, Garrett-yes, Johnson-yes.

It was made a matter of record that Oller Cemetery Lot #333, Graves 1-2 were sold. Mr. Garrett mentioned he would talk to the landowner adjacent to Oller Cemetery about possible land acquisition.

Open positions on both zoning boards were discussed. Interested residents are Steve Smith and Kim Cellar for Zoning Commission Board, and Eric Crawford, Tim Dempsey, and Bob Nagode for Board of Zoning Appeals (BZA). Mr. Johnson moved and Mr. Garrett seconded to appoint Steve Smith as Zoning Commission Board alternate member. Vote: Koch-yes, Garrett-yes, Johnson-yes. In addition, motion was made by Mr. Garrett and seconded by Mr. Johnson to appoint Bob Nagode as member, and Eric Crawford as alternate member of the Board of Zoning Appeals. Vote: Koch-no, Garrett-yes, Johnson-yes. Chairwoman Koch noted the BZA already has one alternate member, Jason Haney, and does not understand why he was not moved up as regular member.

Vince Sperlock of the former State Juvenile Facility told Mr. Johnson there are old photos and artifacts and a grandfather clock that the State would like to donate to the Township. Mr. Johnson noted the historical information about the facility is very interesting. He is still trying to schedule a tour of the facility for residents.

A complaint was received about cattails on Irish Hills Drive due to a drainage issue. A few years ago the Trustees inspected a tile on Duffy Road that was installed too high, resulting in drainage problems at Irish Hills. The area will be checked again.

A complaint was received about The Barn at Chestnut Lane having two weekends of large parties and increased traffic and noise. The Barn owner was contacted in March, and told the business was non-compliant with township zoning, county building department or fire department regulations. Mr. Johnson asked if there should be a change of zoning from agricultural to commercial use also? Zoning Inspector Irvine has forwarded the case to the Prosecutor's Office for further advice since the facility is still operating.

A complaint was received from a resident at 7070 Rob Roy Drive about weeds on an adjacent lot. Mr. Garrett would like to assemble information about rural versus city regulations. Townships do not have mowing ordinances like cities and cannot order an owner to mow. A lengthy legal process can be filed against a landowner if noxious weeds are involved on a property. Mr. Irvine was going to call the owner (bank) of the lot to see if they would mow.

A complaint was received from 10692 Edgewood Drive about abandoned vehicles at a neighboring property. Mr. Irvine will inspect.

Mr. Cooper, Ms. Koch and Ms. Davis met with KLA Risk Consulting, risk management firm for OTARMA. The township is in good shape, and the playgrounds were inspected after the meeting.

Mr. Cooper attended a Dam Safety meeting on behalf of the township.

Mr. Cooper reported the Road Department is still gathering bid information for a new dump truck. Trustee Garrett suggested talking to the Etna Township administrator since they just completed the process. Etna Township is comparable to Concord's size, budget and services.

Chief Cooper would like to trade and/or replace the old Dodge Durango at the Fire Department, and get a half ton, four wheel drive pickup truck. The Durango needs a \$1,200 oil pump, and the current state bid cost for a new truck would be about \$26,800.00. The truck would be used as a station vehicle for training classes, store runs, supplies, etc so that personal vehicles are not used. Mr. Johnson would like to review the fire department's capital budget projections before moving forward.

Access to the east side of the township during round-a-bout construction was discussed. Brian Diley from the Delaware County Engineer's office will meet every three days with Chief and Trucco Construction to verify access for fire and EMS services.

Two bids (out of six companies) for property clean-up at 5731 Henderson Drive, Delaware, Ohio were received. Hoffman Lawn & Landscape Co, LLC quoted \$1,000.00, and Ostrander Implement quoted \$740.00. Motion was made by Mr. Johnson and seconded by Mr. Garrett to award cleanup job to

Ostrander Implement for \$740.00. Vote: Koch-yes, Garrett-yes, Johnson-yes. There will be an additional fee if a Sheriff deputy and/or dog warden is needed for assistance. A final letter will be posted for the homeowner to respond by Monday before cleanup is scheduled and assessed to their property tax bill.

Mr. Garrett discussed EMS topics and soft billing for patient transport. This income to the township would not be extra to the taxpayer; the amount is already figured in insurance, but it is not collected. Most townships in Ohio collect for patient transport.

Replacement of the lobby windows was discussed. Since the two, new test windows have performed well, Mr. Johnson moved to replace. Motion withdrawn. The same windows can be ordered through any vendor. Advanced Glass originally installed. The Prosecutor's office will be consulted prior to action, since the faulty windows were designed by the building architect.

Acoustic panels will be installed soon in the township building community room.

Regarding future purchase of 7990 Dublin Road, Delaware, Ohio, Mr. Johnson mentioned the generator at the State property will be left there, and is worth \$40-50,000. Parking lights will also be staying. Mr. Johnson talked to a contractor about the Del-Co water and fire tap loop system at the property. The comprehensive plan meeting mentioned the property could possibly house a satellite station for the Sheriff's office if space available.

Mr. Garrett has received more complaints about jake brake use on Section Line Road.

Chairman Koch certified the Fiscal Officer has provided current financial reports for the township. Completing business the Fiscal Officer certified funds have been appropriated and money is in the treasury to pay the bills. Therefore, Mr. Garrett moved and Mr. Johnson seconded to approve pending purchase orders, blanket certificates, and warrants #1254-1257, 10318-10351, all totaling \$137,174.49. Vote: Koch-yes, Garrett-yes, Johnson-yes. General Fund balance to date is \$5,090,656.55, and total all funds (General and Special Revenue) is \$9,261,043.83.

As there was no further business, motion was made by Mr. Garrett to adjourn. Mr. Johnson seconded the motion. Vote: Koch-yes, Garrett-yes, Johnson-yes. Meeting adjourned 9:30 p.m.
