## **Call to Order**

The Concord Township Board of Trustees met in regular session on Wednesday, May 24, 2017 at 7:00 p.m. at the Concord Township Administrative Building. Chairman Bart Johnson called the meeting to order. In attendance were: Trustees Bart Johnson, Joe Garrett, and Jason Haney. Fiscal Officer Jill Davis, Fire Chief Todd Cooper, Zoning Inspector Ric Irvine, and several guests were also present.

Mr. Haney moved and Mr. Garrett seconded to approve the minutes from the April 19, 2017 meeting. Vote: Haney-yes, Garrett-yes, Johnson-yes.

Mr. Garrett moved and Mr. Johnson seconded to approve the minutes from the April 26, 2017 meeting. Vote: Haney-abstain/absent, Garrett-yes, Johnson-yes.

Mr. Haney moved and Mr. Garrett seconded to approve the minutes from the May 10, 2017 meeting. Vote: Haney-yes, Garrett-yes, Johnson-yes.

# **Public Input**

Mr. Steve Locker of Locker Soccer, attended previously to discuss field use and programming. He would like to discuss the fees for preparing budgets and signups. He will offer recreational soccer for 5-6 year olds, with 25-30% fee discount for township residents. Trustee Johnson would like to see field improvements more than monetary fee, and the field use managed. Fee discussed was \$1,000 per season, plus work equity. Mr. Locker has eight teams that would use the fields daily, along with seven Saturday mornings after Labor Day for the rec program. Advertising methods were suggested. A field use agreement needs to be completed. Trustee Haney noted any company banners displayed by Locker Soccer need to be paid advertising through Bellpoint Youth Athletic Association.

Health Department representative, Lori Kannally, distributed the Delaware County Youth Risk Behavior Survey results. The survey examined the health choices of 6th-12th graders in Delaware County schools, including the topics of weight and physical activity, tobacco use, drug use, sexual behaviors, alcohol use, mental health/suicide, seatbelt safety, weapon use, bullying and physical violence. Ms. Kannally said Delaware County was below state and national averages in most cases. To view the report, go to:

Mosquito traps are being placed soon, and areas will not be fogged until positive mosquitoes are found in traps.

A few residents informed the Trustees that curb replacements along Tree Lake Blvd had damaged their sprinkler systems, and one cracked sidewalk. Sprinklers were not supposed to be in the easement area, but the contractor was supposed to dig carefully. Trustee Johnson will work on a solution. He encouraged residents to sign up for website notifications. In the future, notice of repairs will be posted 7-10 days before work.

Michelle Brenner, who lives behind Eli Pinney school, asked for information about a possible bike/walking path along Concord Road. Trustee Johnson shared Dublin and the County started a plan, which then came down to cost. The township previously corrected the existing curved path for bike safety, and committed \$30,000 toward the new project, but has not heard anything since. Trustee Garrett feels there are safety concerns even with the new plan. He does not want kids to have a false sense of security with new path lines placed across the road; they still will have to stop and look. The possibility of resident funding was mentioned. Trustee Johnson said the township would re-evaluate general funding after the fire station was completed at the end of June.

Mr. Pete Kerr of Industrial Contracting, mentioned concerns about not being paid for foundation work at the new township fire station. He is owed about \$180,000 by the general contractor. There were issues with the concrete, but they were going to make it right. It was noted the township is still dealing with concrete issues that the contractor is now having to cover themselves.

## **Old Business**

The TIF proposal from the Delaware County Commissioners was discussed. Mr. Johnson moved to adopt a Resolution #052417-1 opposing the TIF proposed by the

Delaware County Commissioners, specifically objecting to the length of the TIF being greater than ten years, the percentage of tax on improvements being greater than 75%, for the parcels #41933002065000, 41933002014007, 41933002006003, 41933002006004, 41933002006000, 41933002005000. Mr. Garrett seconded this motion. Upon roll call vote: Haney-yes, Garrett-yes, Johnson-yes.

Trustee Garrett noted he is meeting with Commissioner Merrell and Mr. Frommer next week. He feels the TIF is insulting because of no communication by the County, and Mr. Lamb adding that the Trustees wanted the TIF.

## **New Business**

It was made a matter of record that Oller Cemetery lot #271, grave 4 was sold.

# **Zoning Department**

Zoning Inspector Ric Irvine reported the phase one of Clarkshaw Moors is still under review, a Regional Planning meeting is scheduled for tomorrow, and seven permits have been issued for May.

The Epcon/Price project has asked approval to build on 15 lots without road installed first. Mr. Irvine will review with Fire Chief Cooper.

The old Williams Realty property was recently reviewed for use as a lawn business. Current B-2 zoning does not allow that use.

## Road, Maintenance, and Fire Departments

After discussion, Mr. Garrett moved and Mr. Johnson seconded to approve fire station change order for fire sprinkler system end changes in the amount of \$4091.94. Vote: Haney-yes, Garrett-yes, Johnson-yes.

Mr. Johnson moved and Mr. Garrett seconded to approve purchase of three refrigerators with icemakers from Lowe's for the new fire station in the amount of \$3,897.00. Vote: Haney-yes, Garrett-yes, Johnson-yes.

The damage to irrigation systems during ADA curb ramp replacements was discussed. The Trustees will hold a special meeting Friday, May 26, 2017 at 8:00am to discuss with the contractor.

Fire station update: cabinet adjustments are being made and the kitchen progress is ongoing, the second batch of concrete flooring will not polish in the living areas, the bay area concrete is also bad, and the ceilings are being painted. Discussion held on concrete repairs and/or remedies. Options will be included in the agenda for the special meeting on Friday, May 26, 2017 at 8:00am.

The current fire station lease with Columbus will be extended two more months.

The Bean Oller Road tile repair is ongoing and on schedule.

### **Financial**

Chairman Johnson certified the Fiscal Officer provided current financial reports for the township. The current Cash Summary by Fund balances were: General Fund \$5,281,177.79, and Special Revenue Funds (Motor Vehicle License Taxes, Gas Tax, Cemetery, Road, and Fire Funds) \$3,972,582.02.

Bank statements for April were reviewed and initialed by the Board.

The Fiscal Officer certified funds have been appropriated and money is in the treasury to pay the bills. Therefore, Mr. Garrett moved and Mr. Haney seconded to approve all pending purchase orders, vouchers, and warrants #1614-1617, 12882-12911, totaling \$286,582.51. Vote: Haney-yes, Garrett-yes, Johnson-yes.

As there was no further business, *Mr. Garrett moved and Mr. Haney seconded to adjourn. Vote: Haney-yes, Garrett-yes, Johnson-yes.* Meeting adjourned.
