CONCORD TOWNSHIP BOARD OF TRUSTEES

July 11, 2018

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Call to Order

The Concord Township Board of Trustees met in regular session on July 11, 2018 at 7:00 pm at the Concord Township Administrative Building, 6385 Home Road, Delaware, Ohio 43015. Chairman Johnson called the meeting to order with roll call. Attending were Trustees Bart Johnson, Joe Garrett, and Jason Haney. Also present were Fiscal Officer Jill Davis, Director of Operations/Fire Chief Todd Cooper, and Zoning Inspector Ric Irvine.

Minutes

Mr. Garrett moved and Mr. Johnson seconded to approve the minutes from the previous meeting with one correction. Vote: Haney-yes, Garrett-yes, Johnson-yes.

Public Input

Concord Road Path update: The construction plans are finished but the City of Dublin had a few comments for engineering, then the project will go to bid. The Trustees will work with the Tartan Fields HOA on re-landscaping so it still looks nice after the project. Depending on how long the project takes, some items may have to be finished in the spring, like final grading, seeding, and landscaping. The City of Dublin will oversee the project construction. A grant packet from ODNR was completed for funding of the township's portion of the project. Flashing lights will also need to be purchased for about \$12,000 (lights similar to Glick Road by the pool). Tartan Fields HOA would like to be involved in selection of the flashing lights.

Lori Kannally of the Delaware General Health District shared county-wide health assessment data (attached), overdose data from 2017, and that two mosquito traps were positive for West Nile virus in Porter and Trenton Townships. More information is available at their website delawarehealth.org.

Financial

Chairman Johnson certified the Fiscal Officer provided current financial reports of the township. The Cash Summary by Fund report shows current cash balances of: General Fund \$5,583,221.21, Special Revenue (Fire, Road, Cemetery) Funds \$2,767,103.49, all totaling \$8,350,324.70.

The Fiscal Officer certified money is in the treasury, and funds have been appropriated to pay the bills. *Therefore, Mr. Haney moved and Mr. Johnson seconded to approve pending purchase orders, vouchers, and warrants #1755-1758, 13893-14010, all totaling \$96, 241.30. Vote: Haney-yes, Garrett-abstain/ck#13975, Johnson-yes.*

Old Business

The Delaware County Sheriff has begun special duty shifts in the township, but three shifts were unfilled for June. The Trustees decided to not make up the shifts, but continue with fifteen each in July and August.

Update on the 6893 South Section Line Road nuisance property: Only half of the house was torn down by today. The homeowner did not sign the agreement with the township for total removal of the structure. The structure remains open, accessible, and a hazard. The Prosecutor's office requested the township have yet another inspection of the property performed by Delaware County Code Compliance.

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Fire/Road/Maintenance Departments

Director of Operations and Fire Chief, Todd Cooper, reported the Quint fire truck participated in the July 4th parade in Ostrander. A nice photo of the truck was taken and edited by resident, Todd Huss. Thank you, Todd!

The fire department union contract renewal negotiations will begin in August.

The Klondike Park (old Bellepoint) concession stand was removed today.

ADA ramps in Scioto Reserve will be reviewed for the next meeting.

Two painting quotes were received for the maintenance building; waiting on one more.

Tree plaques are installed at the park for Karen Koch's and Barb Hughes' trees.

The County's road salt bid was open in March-April, so is already closed for this winter.

Chief Cooper recommended the hiring of Kyle Helfer, from part-time to full-time firefighter. *After discussion, Mr. Johnson moved and Mr. Garrett seconded to approve the hiring of Kyle Helfer as full-time firefighter, effective August 12, 2018, with a swearing in ceremony on August 8, 2018. Vote: Haney-yes, Garrett-yes, Johnson-yes.*

Charter Hill Construction sent a charge for \$6,524.20 for concrete that was installed instead of asphalt at the new fire station. Chief Cooper will get more information.

Chief Cooper mentioned his phone service will be covered while on vacation.

While the newer medic truck was getting some paint fixed, the backup medic needed towed. The department used a different department's medic truck for service.

The Southeastern Equipment invoice to convert the fixed road broom to an angle broom has been voided. The township will pay the original angle broom quoted amount.

The bed edger warrant was voided and will be applied to fire station landscaping.

Mr. Haney noted a pile of mulch still needs spread at the playset, and areas that can't be mowed or weedeaten need mulched.

Two more bids for township security cameras will be ready for next meeting. The quality of the first bid may not be what the township wants.

Zoning Department

Zoning Inspector, Ric Irvine, reported for June he has issued permits for 23 houses, 3 revisions, and 1 addition. Permits to date have reached a total of 140, which the township has not seen since 2004.

The Clarkshaw Road developments are starting to get busy, as well as the Manley Road Epcon project near Muirfield.

Mr. Irvine thanked assistant Angie Ellerbrock for keeping things going between the zoning department, building rentals, and helping the Fiscal Officer. She is very busy.

A second letter has been sent to the owners of the run-down property at the corner of Klondike Road and Bellepoint Road. A second letter has also been sent to the owner of the run-down property at US 42 and Dublin Road. An initial letter has been sent to the owner of the run-down property at Butts Road and Riverside Drive.

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Mr. Irvine noted the Epcon project near Muirfield has barrier mounding against a neighboring property that is not accurate with our township zoning drawings. For some reason the topography of the project is higher, so that when standing next to a housing unit, one can see over the mound and into the second story of the neighboring home. The Trustees suggested to not issue any more permits until it can be checked. Mr. Irvine also has issue with construction taking place before roads are down.

New Business

M/I Homes has requested using RCC (rolled compacted concrete) for a road base for the Clarkshaw development. Other township developments that used the same material are holding up well. After discussion, Mr. Garrett moved and Mr. Haney seconded to approve M/I Homes using RCC as road material to Delaware County standards. Vote: Haney-yes, Garrett-yes, Johnson-yes.

Fiscal Officer

After declaring it a necessity (Res.#061318-3) to levy a tax in excess of the 10 mill limit at the June 13, 2018 meeting, and obtaining a certificate of revenue from the County Auditor in the amount of \$1,207,831, Mr. Garrett moved and Mr. Haney seconded to adopt Resolution #071118-1 (attached) to proceed with submission of the question of the fire levy renewal of 2.9 mill, on the November 6, 2018 ballot, for the purpose of providing and maintaining fire apparatus, appliances, buildings, or sites therefor, or sources of water supply and materials therefor, or the establishment and maintenance of lines of fire alarm telegraph or the payment of permanent and part-time firefighters or fire-fighting companies to operate the same, including the payment of firefighter employer's contribution required under section 742.34 of the Ohio Revised Code, or to purchase ambulance equipment, or to provide ambulance, paramedic, or other emergency medical services operated by the fire department, said purposes being authorized by ORC 5705.19(I), for a period of five years, first levied in 2019 and first collected in 2020. Vote: Haney-yes, Garrett-yes, Johnson-yes.

The 2018-19 winter road salt bid results through Southwest Ohio Purchasers for Government (SWOP4G) were presented. The township's lowest bid received was from Compass Mineral at \$84.16 per ton, but Compass amended their bid to a minimum purchase of 80% of the bid quantity requested. *After discussion, Mr. Johnson moved and Mr. Haney seconded to award the 2018-19 winter road salt bid to Compass Mineral at \$84.16 per ton, pending the ability to lower the township's bid quantity request of 1250 tons. Vote: Haney-yes, Garrett-yes, Johnson-yes.*

Correspondence was received from outside attorney Mr. Paul-Michael La Fayette, regarding the current status of the OPEC-Healthcare Cooperative and Ohio Insurance Services legal cases. No end is in sight.

The Oller Cemetery - Keller Section expansion was cleared. The next step is to move ground, level it out some, and get a plan so we know where the drives are going. Mr. Garrett will call Patridge Survey about the plan.

The OPERS pension system has chosen to work with Colonial Life to offer guaranteed issue life policies to active OPERS members. Information was given to Trustees. Open enrollment is June 1, 2018 - August 31, 2018.

Correspondence was received from the Delaware General Health District regarding a health nuisance complaint at 6037 Edgewood Circle.

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Per the request of Linda Hoetger of ZERO - The End of Prostate Cancer, a national nonprofit with the mission to end prostate cancer, Mr. Johnson moved and Mr. Garrett seconded to adopt Resolution #071118-2 (attached) declaring September as Prostate Cancer Awareness Month. Vote: Haney-yes, Garrett-yes, Johnson-yes.

The system to recommend and dispense medical marijuana will be fully operational on September 8, 2018, and employers need to decide how they will respond. The Ohio Township Association will hold a webinar on the subject on August 23, 2018 through Working Partners. The township handbook and policies will be reviewed.

An updated fuel bid award through the State of Ohio Cooperative Purchasing program was received.

As there was no further business, Mr. Garrett moved and Mr. Haney seconded to adjourn. Vote: Haney-yes, Garrett-yes, Johnson-yes.

RESOLUTION NO. 071118-2 IN THE MATTER OF DECLARING SEPTEMBER AS PROSTATE CANCER AWARENESS MONTH

It was moved by Mr. Johnson, and seconded by Mr. Garrett, to approve the following:

Whereas, this year approximately 164,690 men will be diagnosed with prostate cancer in the United States alone – that is one man diagnosed every 3.2 minutes, and roughly 29,430 will die this year from the disease – which is one man every 18 minutes; and

Whereas, in Ohio an estimated 5,810 new cases of prostate cancer will be diagnosed, and an estimated 1,110 deaths will occur in 2018; and

Whereas, men with relatives – father, brother, son – with a history of prostate cancer are twice as likely to develop the disease; and

Whereas, prostate cancer is the most commonly diagnosed cancer in American men, and the third leading cause of cancer deaths behind lung and colon cancers; and

Whereas, 1 in 9 men are diagnosed with prostate cancer in his lifetime. 1 in 6 African American men will develop prostate cancer in his lifetime. Overall, African American men are 1.7 times more likely to be diagnosed with—and 2.3 times more likely to die from—prostate cancer than white men; and

Whereas, veterans who are exposed to herbicides like Agent Orange are at increased risk for developing prostate cancer, and are more likely to have an aggressive form of the disease; and

Whereas, education regarding prostate cancer and early detection is critical to saving lives, preserving, and protecting our families. The economic and social burden of prostate cancer is huge. Prostate cancer is estimated to cost over \$8 billion in direct medical expenditures; and

Whereas, if caught early, prostate cancer has a five-year survival rate of nearly 100%; however for late stage prostate cancer the five-year survival rate is 29%; and

Whereas, all men are at risk for prostate cancer, and we encourage the citizens of Concord Township to increase the importance of prostate screenings;

Therefore be it Resolved by the Board of Trustees of Concord Township, that September is declared Prostate Cancer Awareness Month in Concord Township.
