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Call to Order

The Concord Township Board of Trustees met in regular session on Monday, February 22, 2016 at the Concord Township Administrative Building. Chairman Bart Johnson called the meeting to order at 7:05 pm.

The roll was called, and attending were Trustees Jason Haney, Joe Garrett, and Bart Johnson. Other staff present included Fiscal Officer Jill Davis, Operations Director and Fire Chief Todd Cooper, and Zoning Inspector Ric Irvine.

Mr. Garrett moved and Mr. Haney seconded to approve the minutes from the previous meeting, February 8, 2016. Vote: Haney-yes, Garrett-yes, Johnson-yes.

Public Input

Conner Walls introduced himself to the Board. He is from a Powell Boy Scout troop, and is working on a merit badge.

Bob Lamb, Delaware County Economic Development Director, was invited to give an overview on what the Township can do to spur economic growth. Mr. Lamb highlighted two major programs being developed at the County level, one being the Economic Development Strategic Plan. Officials from area schools and governments will provide input from now through June, then a draft of the Plan will be completed June-August based on the input. A comment period will follow in the fall, and the Plan will be submitted to the County Commissioners in December. The partnership will address economic and school needs, among other things. Mr. Johnson shared the Township's biggest concern is annexation. How can the Township protect itself? Mr. Garrett added, how do we attract business, rather than lose it to annexation. Mr. Lamb noted a landowner would have to receive a benefit for annexation to occur.

Joint Economic Development Districts (JEDD) were discussed. A JEDD extends, but cannot exceed, the local jurisdiction income authority, with the revenue shared with another government of usually 20-30%, so it lowers the chance of annexation. There are different requirements for a JEDD; some have to go to vote. The Township would engage a landowner to form the JEDD, and would have to know where and what was going into the JEDD, and the specific use of that revenue. The Township could be in a JEDD to provide services, or provide financial infrastructure by another jurisdiction. A board would be created to leverage use of the funds.

Mr. Johnson shared the State of Ohio/ODOT is limiting curb cuts along US 42. Is there a mechanism to fund access road infrastructure along 42? Mr. Lamb said a TIF (tax increment financing) would probably work better for that scenario, where taxes would be delineated to another use, example of 75% of revenue over ten years, and diverted to public infrastructure. TIF funds can be used for infrastructure, roads, payback or purchase, or demolition of a building. Once again, there are different requirements and factors, like between residential and commercial property. Residential property is less likely to provide a TIF. Commercial property doesn't affect school revenue, and can go up to thirty years. It depends on the valuation after the TIF is in place. The TIF would not affect property taxes to fire, roads, and schools receiving, only on the increase from the base valuation amount. It is like a "redirection" of existing taxes. Example of a \$100,000 property, a TIF created, the property value increases to \$200,000; could collect \$10,000 in base tax, plus collect 75% of the increase, or another \$75,000, for a total of \$85,000 toward infrastructure. Therefore, TIFs are almost always driven by a project.

Mr. Garrett asked if there are other funds or grants available to townships in this area. Mr. Lamb responded the State will help with job creation and buildings, but the federal level would not help due to the county's average household income level being too high. The County may be able to help depending on the details, industry, sales tax revenue, payback, etc. Mr. Johnson asked if the Township could partner with the City? Mr. Lamb shared that Liberty Township and the City of Powell entered a moratorium on annexation, and created a JEDD, which protects the township, a percentage of tax is collected, the city

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provides sewer, and township provides road services, etc. JEDDs must be with neighboring areas. Mr. Haney noted since a JEDD is creating a tax and TIF is a redirection of current tax, they can be used together. Mr. Lamb agreed; Berkshire Township did both.

In summary, Mr. Lamb said the US 42 corridor could be an important economic area, and he encouraged the township to participate in the strategic plan survey.

Old Business

The recommendation of the fire station construction contractor was received from Mull & Weithman Architects, which was the second lowest bidder, Thomas & Marker Construction. The Prosecutor's office informed Mr. Johnson that the Board can choose the lowest and best, or lowest bid received, therefore the Board of Trustees can choose either of the lowest two bidders, Charter Hill Construction or Thomas & Marker Construction. Additional feedback was received from Mr. Haney and Mr. Cooper, who were present for the contractor interviews. The Trustees shared pros and cons of both contractors, the main concerns being responsiveness to issues and change orders. After much discussion, Mr. Haney moved and Mr. Garrett seconded to award the Fire Station #341 Construction project to the lowest bidder, Charter Hill Construction Inc. Upon roll call vote: Haney-yes, Garrett-yes, Johnson-yes.

The 2016 road improvement program estimate was reviewed from the County Engineer's office. Mr. Johnson discussed a few changes with Mike Metzger to change from the fiber sami road treatment to a different product which lowered costs. After discussion, Mr. Garrett moved and Mr. Haney seconded to approve the 2016 road improvement program estimate in the amount of \$352,345.51 (attached). Upon roll call vote: Haney-yes, Garrett-yes, Johnson-yes.

It was noted Mr. Haney will be meeting with the website designer tomorrow.

Two positions remain open on the Board of Zoning Appeals (BZA), and three people have submitted interest statements. The Trustees plan to recommend appointments for the positions at the next meeting.

New Business

A letter was received from the Zoning Commission Board (ZC), dated February 19, 2016, that the ZC has approved application #ZC042015 for the development plan referred to as Scioto Ridge Crossing, for a planned residential district on 80.67 acres on South Section Line Road, parcel #41933002014007. The Trustees scheduled a hearing for March 14, 2016 at 6:00 pm, and were given notes from the Regional Planning Commission regarding the proposed development.

It was noted the Trustees would like to discuss scheduling the township building for township business use at the next meeting.

Correspondence was received from Ohio Insurance Services Agency noting the COBRA administration fee was waived for 2016.

Fiscal Officer Davis shared that the current invoice from M&W Architects was not paid in full, due to the requested draw for construction administration, which has not begun.

The Township annual inventory was presented to the Trustees.

Zoning Department

Zoning Inspector Ric Irvine reported five permits were issued to date for February.

Operations Director

Fire Chief and Operations Director, Todd Cooper, reported the following:

--The fire department will hold its annual awards banquet on April 8, 2016 at 6:30 pm at the township building.

- --It was noted the next Trustees meeting will be held in the conference room due to the Board of Elections setting up for elections.

- --Past Delaware City Chief Wilbur Bills passed away, and the Concord Township Fire Department will participate in the Wednesday funeral; firefighter Jack Guyton will also play bagpipes.

Financial

Chairman Johnson certified the Fiscal Officer provided current financial reports for the township. The current Cash Summary by Fund balances are: General Fund \$4,272,207.59, and all Special Revenue Funds \$5,346,881.27.

The Fiscal Officer certified funds have been appropriated and money is in the treasury to pay the bills. Therefore, Mr. Garrett moved and Mr. Haney seconded to approve pending purchase orders, vouchers, and warrants #1465-1472, 11764-11795, void 11784, all totaling \$277,687.26. Vote: Haney-yes, Garrett-yes, Johnson-yes.

As there was no further business, Mr. Garrett moved and Mr. Haney seconded to adjourn. Vote: Haney-yes, Garrett-yes, Johnson-yes.
