Call to Order

The Concord Township Board of Trustees met in regular session on Wednesday, May 13, 2026 at the Concord Township Community Building, 6385 Home Road, Delaware, Ohio. Vice Chairman Joe Garrett called the meeting to order at 7:02 p.m. The roll was called: Jason Haney-present, Joe Garrett-present, Bart Johnson-absent for roll call (arrived at 7:20 p.m.).

Financial Report

Mr. Garrett certified Fiscal Officer Davis provided financial reports to the Board, and money is available to pay bills. The current Cash Summary by Fund shows the following balances:

- General Fund	\$13,561,074.74
- Fire, Road, Special Funds	<u>\$ 1,882,557.57</u>
- Total All Funds	\$15,443,632.31

Mr. Garrett moved and Mr. Haney seconded to approve pending vouchers, warrants and purchase orders #57-63, void 119384, #119590-119644, excluding #119593, all totaling \$253,087.78. Vote: Haney-yes, Garrett-yes.

Mr. Johnson moved and Mr. Haney seconded to approve pending warrant #119593. Vote: Haney-yes, Garrett-abstain, Johnson-yes.

Mr. Haney moved and Mr. Johnson seconded to approve the minutes of the April 22, 2026 regular meeting. Vote: Haney-yes, Garrett-abstain, Johnson-yes.

Public Input

Ms. Lori Kannally of the Delaware Public Health District presented information on various programs available to Delaware County residents, including a health survey, baby expo, mobile health unit summer clinics, tire disposal event, and mosquito spraying. More information on these programs is attached, and available on the township's and Delaware Public Health District's websites, concordtwp.org and delawarehealth.org. Mr. Haney requested advance communication prior to mosquito spraying in Concord Township so residents can be informed.

Mr. Doug Riedel, Township Liaison from the Delaware County Engineer's Office, participated in a discussion with the Trustees regarding OPWC (Ohio Public Works Commission) grants potentially available to the Township. It was determined the Township would submit a 2026 grant application to improve Freshwater Road in 2027. Mr. Nathan Wilgus, Road Supervisor, will work with Mr. Riedel on a Request for Engineering Assistance (REA) on this project.

Zoning Department

Zoning Inspector Ric Irvine provided the following updates:

- Zoning Permits issued since the previous report: 2 homes, 3 decks, 1 gazebo, and 1 revision.
- The Township has not received any updates from the State of Ohio regarding the Sober House property on Riverside Drive. Mr. Garrett reported that State Representative Brian Lorenz has contacted the Director of the Ohio Department of Behavioral Health and will be scheduling a meeting to discuss.
- A Board of Zoning Appeals meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, May 19 to discuss two variances. A Board of Zoning Commission meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, June 9.
- There was discussion about two possible zoning issues as reported by residents. Regarding the first situation on Maynard Road, it does not appear there are any zoning violations, but Mr. Irvine will review and confirm. Regarding the second situation on South Section Line Road, construction has been ongoing for an extended period and building materials are being stored on site in public view. It does not appear there are any zoning violations, but Mr. Irvine will contact the property owner and request the property be cleaned up. The zoning code may need revised going forward to address similar situations. There was conversation about creating a formal complaint recording process to ensure Trustees are aware of the status of all zoning complaints.

- There has been an inquiry from a resident who wants to build a private gun range on his property. Multiple zoning and safety issues would need to be addressed for this land use to be approved. Legal Counsel Mr. Chris Rinehart clarified that while a property owner has the right to shoot guns on their property, the Township has the right to regulate land use with respect to bullets leaving the property, requiring whatever safety precautions are necessary to prevent bullets from leaving the property. It was agreed that Mr. Garrett would contact the Delaware County Prosecutor's Office for further clarification.

Road/Cemetery/Park Department

Road Supervisor Nathan Wilgus provided the following updates:

- Decker Construction began today on concrete and curb ramps. No timeline for repaving yet.
- There was conversation about coordinating gutter repairs in Tartan Fields with a resident who wants to replace his driveway apron. Mr. Wilgus will attempt to follow up with the resident.
- A resident in attendance asked about a large hole marked by cones in her neighborhood ditch. Mr. Wilgus reported that will be repaired when the road is paved within the next few weeks.
- There was a conversation about accidental damage to a resident's irrigation heads located in the Township's road right of way, which was repaired by the township. Mr. Garrett will follow up with Delaware County Assistant Prosecutor Vince Villio about irrigation systems in the Township right of way.
- The windscreen has been reinstalled on the pickleball courts, and the fence topper for the ball field chain link fence has been received.
- There was a conversation about fiber optic installation in the Township right of way, and instances where the vendors have not restored the grounds to their previous condition. It was agreed that these vendors will be advised of the Township's intent to proceed to seek recovery pursuant to the bonds on file for costs associated with repairs, with a 14 day notice for repairs to be completed by the vendor before a bond is pulled.
- Speed data has been gathered on Scioto Parkway at the request of a resident. This information was shared with the Delaware County Sheriff's Office and they have provided a response which will be shared with the resident.
- There was conversation about the need to replace two pieces of equipment. Mr. Garrett moved and Mr. Haney seconded to approve the purchase of a conveyor belt spreader from The Dexter Company at a cost of \$13,250. Vote: Haney-yes, Garrett-yes, Johnson-yes. Mr. Johnson moved and Mr. Garrett seconded to approve the purchase of a John Deere mulching mower for the park and cemetery at a cost of \$13,046.18 after trade-in. Vote: Haney-yes, Garrett-yes, Johnson-yes.

Legal Counsel Update

Mr. Chris Rinehart, Concord Township Legal Counsel, provided the following updates.

- Letters to the owner of the Sober House property on Riverside Drive have been prepared, acknowledging the withdrawal of their zoning variance application, and reiterating that the property is still in violation of zoning codes. Mr. Garrett shared State Representative Brian Lorenz has contacted the Director of the Ohio Department of Behavioral Health and will be scheduling a meeting to discuss. The letters will be shared with Rep. Lorenz for this meeting.
- Work has begun to update the Zoning Resolution based on the new Comprehensive Plan. There was conversation about needed updates to the zoning code for Planned Residential Developments, and the effects a recent state law will have on the approved use of fireworks.

New Business

- There was a discussion about hiring special duty officers to direct historically heavy traffic on Home Road during the Memorial Tournament in early June. Fiscal Officer Jill Davis will follow up to request special duty officers from the Delaware County Sheriff's Office (DCSO) on June 4, 5, and 6 from 3:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. If the DCSO is unable to fulfill that request, officers from Shawnee Hills may be available.
- The City of Columbus will hold an area easement meeting on June 22 at the township hall.

Old Business

- There was conversation about the status of the Hill Cemetery easement. The land survey was completed, but may change. Various details are still being worked out among various parties.

Fire Department

Chief Todd Cooper provided the following updates.

- The Fire Department has accepted the resignation of part time fire fighter Zach Vernon.
- Lt. Micah Werling recently earned a Bachelor of Science in Fire Administration degree from Bowling Green State University.
- There is a need for new ropes, harnesses, and related equipment. The current equipment was purchased in 2011 and has roughly a ten year lifespan. Mr. Garrett moved and Mr. Haney seconded to purchase new ropes, harnesses, and related equipment from Atlantic Emergency Solutions, at a cost not to exceed \$20,000. Vote: Haney-yes, Garrett-yes, Johnson-yes.

Fiscal Officer Report

Fiscal Officer Jill Davis provided the following updates:

- There was a brief discussion on the revised judgment entry for the property at 8220 Dublin Road. No action taken.
- The Township will receive a \$7,995 refund for unused Workers Compensation premiums prepaid over a three year period for its group retrospective performance.
- The Ohio Township Association (OTA) offers a Township Education Subscription allowing all active and affiliate members from Concord Township to have unlimited access to OTA educational programs. Mr. Johnson moved and Mr. Haney seconded to purchase an OTA Township Education Subscription for \$250. Vote: Haney-yes, Garrett-yes, Johnson-yes.
- Preservation Parks of Delaware County is offering grant money for local park and trail projects. Applications are due by October 1.
- Original drawings from 2019 for the proposed Home Road and Dublin Road roundabout are available in the Township office.

Executive Session

- At 9:21 p.m. Mr. Johnson moved and Mr. Garrett seconded to enter into Executive Session per ORC 121.22(G)(1) to consider the appointment, employment, promotion, and/or compensation of a public employee, and invited Chief Todd Cooper and Fiscal Officer Davis to be part of the discussion. Vote: Haney-yes, Garrett-yes, Johnson-yes.

The Trustees returned to Regular Session at 9:32 p.m.

With no further business, Mr. Haney moved and Mr. Garrett seconded to adjourn; unanimously in favor. Meeting adjourned.

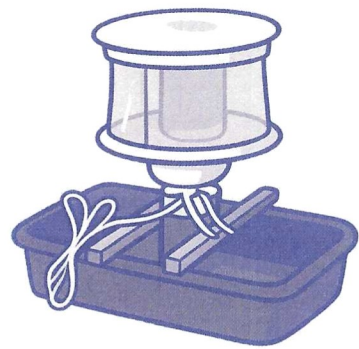
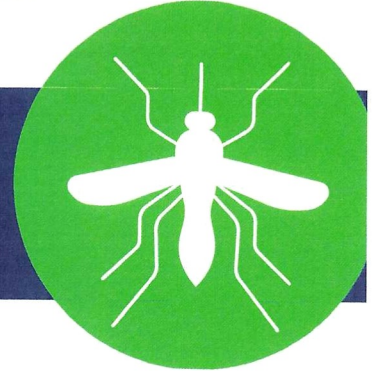

MOSQUITO SURVEILLANCE IN PROGRESS

Health District staff monitor mosquito activity using traps such as this one throughout the county to identify species that may pose a risk to public health.

HOW IT WORKS

Mosquitoes are collected weekly (May-October) for identification and testing. When a trap tests positive, or a human case of mosquito-borne illness is reported, licensed Health District staff respond by spraying within a one-mile radius of the positive trap or human case. Public notification is always provided to residents in advance of any scheduled spraying.

MOSQUITO CONTROL PROGRAM

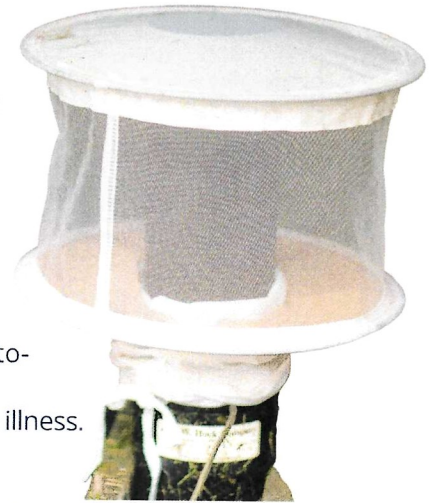
The mosquito control program collects mosquitoes, identifies mosquito-borne diseases, and implements mosquito population controls to prevent human illness. This allows us to inform and protect residents from mosquito-borne diseases.

TRAPPING

- Throughout the mosquito season (typically May – October) DPHD collects mosquitoes from 23 traps that are strategically placed around the county to monitor mosquitoes that may pose a risk to residents.
- Mosquitoes are collected and sorted throughout each week and sent to the Ohio Department of Health lab for identification and testing for West Nile virus (WNV).

SPRAYING

- In response to mosquito breeding grounds, positive traps or a human case of mosquito-borne illness, licensed and trained DPHD staff will respond.
- DPHD only sprays in response to a positive WNV trap or a human case of mosquito-borne illness.
- Treatment varies depending on the environment and the life cycle of the mosquito.



*Spraying only occurs at night to avoid active resident hours and protect honeybees that are only active during the day. Bodies of water, registered apiaries (beehives) and documented no-spray residences are not sprayed.



Residents who do not want their property sprayed can scan QR code to fill out online form or go to go.delawarehealth.org/NoSprayList.

DPHD shares spraying notification and information with the affected city, township and village residents and leaders by:

- Issuing press release to local media and through DPHD social media platforms.
- Updating map on DelawareHealth.org that highlights the exact spraying area.
- Posting signs at intersections to notify affected residents of upcoming spraying.
- Some instances include going door-to-door in the event of a human mosquito-borne disease to distribute prevention information & notify residents of upcoming spraying.

LARVICIDING

- DPHD also receives and responds to mosquito nuisance complaints.
- Staff obtain permission from the property owner to perform on-site assessments, looking for mosquito breeding habitats (standing water, vegetation, mosquito larvae).
 - If found that mosquitoes are breeding in the habitat, staff will treat the area with larvicide, which prevents the larvae from growing into adults.
- DPHD uses two different types of larvicides: growth inhibitors and bacterial controls. Each depends on the body of water size, water flow and environment type.



To request a mosquito habitat assessment and larvicide treatment, residents can scan QR code to fill out online form or go to go.delawarehealth.org/LarvicideRequest.

While a positive trap triggers DPHD to spray an area, residents should always be aware that WNV may already be in their area & protect themselves appropriately:



Use an EPA-registered insect repellent.



Wear light-colored, long-sleeved clothing when possible.



Use air conditioning or window & door screens. Make sure to patch any holes in screens.



Prevent mosquitoes from breeding by emptying containers that hold water every 3-4 days.



Treat rain barrels with larvicide or empty every 3-4 days.
