Call to Order

The Concord Township Board of Trustees met in regular session on Wednesday, July 9, 2025 at the Concord Township Community Building, 6385 Home Road, Delaware, Ohio. Chairman Bart Johnson called the meeting to order at 7:05 p.m. The roll was called: Jason Haney-present, Joe Garrett-absent, Bart Johnson-present.

- Mr. Haney moved and Mr. Johnson seconded to approve the minutes of the Columbus Soccer Academy rezoning meetings on June 11, June 25, and July 1, 2025. Vote: Haney-yes, Johnson-yes.
- Mr. Haney moved and Mr. Johnson seconded to approve the minutes of the June 25, 2025 special meeting. Vote: Haney-yes, Johnson-yes.
- Mr. Johnson moved and Mr. Haney seconded to approve the minutes of the June 25, 2025 regular meeting. Vote: Haney-yes, Johnson-yes.
- Mr. Haney moved and Mr. Johnson seconded to approve the minutes of the July 1, 2025 special JEDD meeting. Vote: Haney-yes, Johnson-yes.

Public Input

- First Sergeant Montoney, Ohio Army National Guard, requested use of two bounce houses for their family day next weekend at the Concord Park shelter. The Trustees approved.
- Lori Kannally, Delaware General Health District, shared flyers (attached) on summer mosquito control, ag tire recycling event, community food survey available online. In addition, there will be a NaloxBox event held in August at Concord Park and other locations. Mr. Johnson moved and Mr. Haney seconded to approve the Memo of Understanding agreement to host a NaloxBox location for the Delaware General Health District, and for Trustee Haney to sign the agreement on behalf of the Board. Vote: Haney-yes, Johnson-yes.
- Resident Dave Perorazio, 8019 Riverside Drive, filed a complaint about the property at 7993 Riverside Drive for incomplete construction, abandoned cars, boats full of water, and yard disaster. Zoning Inspector Irvine said a letter was sent with no response, a second letter was sent today, and if no response in 10 days the complaint goes to the Delaware County Prosecutor's office. Health Department should be contacted about the standing water. Trustee Haney explained there is a specific process the township must follow per Revised Code 505.86 and 505.87 nuisance situations, and they take time.
- Resident Jocelyn Mullens, 6650 Sunset Drive, updated the Board on the dog complaint against her property. She participated in a major dog rescue of 87 Dobermans in Henry County, taking 19 of the dogs. Ten of the dogs have been placed with 9 remaining. She apologized that the neighbors behind her in Tartan Fields have been concerned, but the Sheriff and Humane Society have both been out to check on the dogs. She is doing the best she can for this temporary situation. All the dogs are registered, being treated and taken care of, and waiting to get spayed or neutered for placement with families.
- Mike Crane, engineering consultant with V3 Companies, discussed updating the right-of-way permit form and rules and regulations with legal counsel Mr. Rinehart since bonds may be provided by surety or cash. Seven permits were approved by Trustees through the last meeting, and waiting on fees and bonds payments. It was noted permit application #36 does not need permitted since a homeowner project on their yard side of the right-of-way. The right-of-way permit #11 for DHDC/City of Columbus Water Treatment Plant will be resubmitted soon. A meeting was held with construction representatives where they expressed interest for easement or purchase of the township's parcel on Harriott Road for water treatment transmission lines. Discussion and research will continue.

Financial Report

Mr. Johnson noted Fiscal Officer Davis provided financial reports for the township, and money is available to pay the bills. The current Cash Summary by Fund shows the following balances:

Zoning Department

- Zoning inspector, Ric Irvine, reported the following permits were received since the last meeting: 2 decks, 1 temporary trailer for Epcon, 2 additions, and 1 accessory structure.
- Mr. Irvine requested better communication after rezoning hearings since zoning permits were applied for when the conditional approval was not yet satisfied.
- Assistant Prosecuting Attorney Stocco is preparing a letter about a fence violation.
- No response yet from a second nuisance letter sent about the brick wall along Section Line Road.
- Assistant Prosecuting Attorney Stocco is preparing a letter about a Mohican Drive violation, and property may be in foreclosure.
- Assistant Prosecuting Attorney Stocco is preparing RC505.87 documents for the Mars Hill property, no received yet.
- The Ohio Recovery Housing office reviewed the township's complaint about the Riverside Drive property and will meet with Trustee Haney tomorrow.

Road Department

- Road Superintendent Nathan Wilgus noted the parking regulations letters for Tree Lake Blvd were sent out, effective July 10. Signage will be posted soon.
- Culvert pipe replacements will start next week. Some need coordinated with he County.
- Purchasing a new tool truck and selling the old grass truck were discussed. Specs were provided for a truck with box at Coughlin Marysville fitted and ready to go, leftover stock, below state bid pricing. The vehicle would need a snow plow and light package, and painted or wrapped green if the Trustees do not want white. Green or silver fleet vehicles are no longer available. Mr. Johnson moved and Mr. Haney seconded to approve purchase of the 2024 1T RAM truck with 9ft tool bed box for \$67,155. Vote: Haney-yes, Johnson-yes.
- Mr. Haney moved and Mr. Johnson seconded to declare the following items as no longer in use and to list on GovDeals: "grass" truck, 2006 International medic truck, and inflatable boat. Vote: Haney-yes, Johnson-yes.

Fire Department

- The new medic truck was in the Ostrander July 4th parade, then back to Horton for a few fixes. It should be back next week.
- The one year warranty is up on the quint fire truck, except for a few items. The foam pump needs repair, which is not covered and may cost about \$13,000. Most department repairs and oil changes are taken to the certified mechanic at Orange Township rather than dealerships.

Fiscal Officer / Correspondence

- The State of Ohio Auditor's office is continuing the township's biennial audit.
- Revenue Estimates for 2026 were prepared. Mr. Johnson moved and Mr. Haney seconded to approve the 2026 Revenue Estimates and submit to the County Auditor.
- Upgrades are needed to township computer systems (to Windows 11, data server, etc.). Mr. Johnson moved and Mr. Haney seconded to approve up to \$6,000 for Data Resolutions to upgrade township administrative hardware and software systems. Vote: Haney-yes, Johnson-yes.
- An update was requested on the OPEC Health Consortium law suit from 2017. The township still has \$50,000+ reserved for settlement. As of January 2025 Attorney Paul Lafayette shared there was no update and the State of Ohio was continuing their audit of OPEC-HC.
- Notice was received from the Delaware County Commissioners regarding assessment for Chancel Gate ditch petition project. The township's portion would be \$16,800. The final hearing date is scheduled for July 28 at the Commissioner's office.
- It was noted there has been no response from KORDA on road department facility design.

MOSQUITO CONTROL PROGRAM

The mosquito control program collects mosquitoes, identifies mosquitoborne diseases, and implements mosquito population controls to prevent human illness. This allows us to inform and protect residents from mosquito-borne diseases.

TRAPPING

- Throughout the mosquito season (typically May October) DPHD collects mosquitoes from 23 traps that are strategically placed around the county to monitor mosquitoes that may pose a risk to residents.
- Mosquitoes are collected and sorted throughout each week and sent to the Ohio Department of Health lab for identification and testing for West Nile virus (WNV).



- In response to mosquito breeding grounds, positive traps or a human case of mosquitoborne illness, licensed and trained DPHD staff will respond.
- DPHD only sprays in response to a positive WNV trap or a human case of mosquito-borne illness.
- Treatment varies depending on the environment and the life cycle of the mosquito.

*Spraying only occurs at night to avoid active resident hours and protect honeybees that are only active during the day. Bodies of water, registered apiaries (beehives) and documented no-spray residences are not sprayed.



Residents who do not want their property sprayed can scan QR code to fill out online form or go to go.delawarehealth.org/NoSprayList.

DPHD shares spraying notification and information with the affected city, township and village residents and leaders by:

- Issuing press release to local media and through DPHD social media platforms.
- Updating map on DelawareHealth.org that highlights the exact spraying area.
- Posting signs at intersections to notify affected residents of upcoming spraying.
- Some instances include going door-to-door in the event of a human mosquito-borne disease to distribute prevention information & notify residents of upcoming spraying.

LARVICIDING

- DPHD also receives and responds to mosquito nuisance complaints.
- Staff obtain permission from the property owner to perform on-site assessments, looking for mosquito breeding habitats (standing water, vegetation, mosquito larvae).
 - If found that mosquitoes are breeding in the habitat, staff will treat the area with larvicide, which prevents the larvae from growing into adults.
- DPHD uses two different types of larvicides: growth inhibitors and bacterial controls. Each depends on the body of water size, water flow and environment type.



To request a mosquito habitat assessment and larvicide treatment, residents can scan QR code fill out online form or got to go.delawarehealth.org/LarvicideRequest.

While a positive trap triggers DPHD to spray an area, residents should always be aware that WNV may already be in their area & protect themselves appropriately:



Use an EPA-registered insect repellent.



Wear light-colored, long-sleeved clothing when possible.



Use air conditioning or window & door screens. Make sure to patch any holes in screens.



Prevent mosquitoes from breeding by emptying containers that hold water every 3-4 days.



Treat rain barrels with larvicide or empty every 3-4 days.
